The Laos-Born Community in Victoria — 2016 Census (ranked 75)



Demographic characteristics

At the 2016 Census, there were 2,224 Laos-born persons in Victoria (21.4% of Australia's total), ranked 75th among the overseas-born population in Victoria. The Laos-born increased by 3.0% (64) from 2,160 persons in 2011. They are distributed throughout Metropolitan Melbourne, with concentrations in the LGAs of Brimbank (15.5%), Hume (9.7%), Casey (8.0%), Greater Dandenong (7.5%) and Knox (6.5%).

The Laos-born reflected a maturing age profile: 5.9% were aged 25 years and below; 29.2% were aged 26-44 years; 55.9% were aged 45-64 years; and 14.9% were aged 65 years and over. The median age was 50 years, compared to 37 years for total Victoria. The gender ratio was 83 males to 100 females, compared to 96 males to 100 females for total Victoria.

There were 3,275 persons identified with Lao ancestry. Most of them were born in Laos (48.7%) and Australia (40.3%). Three-quarters (76.9%) of the Laos-born in Victoria had arrived in Australia prior to 1996; 4.1% arrived in 1996-2000; 3.1% arrived in 2001-2005; 4.9% arrived in 2006-2010; and 7.2% arrived in 2011-2016.

The Laos-born speak Lao (62.5%), Hmong (7.4%), Mandarin (5.5%), Vietnamese (4.1%) and Thai (1.9%); 12.1% speak English only. Of those who speak a language other than English, 29.8% speak English not well/not at all. The Laos-born population follow mainly Buddhism (70.3%), Catholic (3.6%) and Nature Religions (2.8%); 13.4% have no religion. Most (86.6%) of the Laos-born (86.6%) have Australian citizenship, compared to 58.3% for the total overseas-born population in Victoria.





Economic characteristics

The education levels of the Laos-born are lower than for total Victoria: 15.6% have a bachelor degree or higher and 15.8% have an advanced diploma and diploma and a certificate, compared to 24.4% and 23.6% for Victoria. Half (49.4%) have school education only and 14.0% have no educational attainment, compared to 38.7% and 1.0% for Victoria.

The labour force participation rate of the Laos-born at 59.4% is similar to total Victoria at 60.5%. Their unemployment rate at 7.9% is higher than total Victoria at 6.6%.

The occupational patterns of the Laos-born are different from those for total Victoria. Less of the Laos-born work as managers (8.2%), professionals (11.0%) and community and personal services workers (6.9%), compared to 13.5%, 23.3% and 10.6% for Victoria. More of them work as machinery operators and drivers (19.3%) and labourers (23.4%) than Victoria (5.8% and 9.0%).

The industry of employment patterns of the Laos-born are different from total Victoria. More of them are employed in manufacturing (28.6%) and transport, postal and warehousing (8.2%), compared to 7.8% and 4.8% for Victoria. Less of them are employed in construction (4.5%), professional, scientific, technical and administration (7.8%), education and training (2.6%) and healthcare and social assistance (7.3%), compared to Victoria (8.3%, 11.4%, 8.6% and 12.5%).

The weekly personal income distribution pattern for the Laos-born is different from total Victoria: 12.2% receive nil income and 24.19% receive \$1,\$399, compared to 9.7% and 20.1% for Victoria; 14.3% receive \$1,250 or more, compared with 21.1% for Victoria.
