

The Syria-Born Community in Victoria – 2016 Census (ranked 66)



At the 2016 Census, there were 3,851 Syria-born persons in Victoria (25.1% of Australia's total), ranked 66th among the overseas-born communities in Victoria. The Syria-born increased by 70.2% (1,589) from 2,262 persons in 2011. They are distributed throughout Metropolitan Melbourne, with major concentrations in the LGAs of Hume (37.8%) and Whittlesea (13.8%), Moreland (7.5%), Brimbank (6.0%) and Casey (4.7%).

The Syria-born reflected a balanced age profile: 23.2% were aged 25 years and under; 31.3% were aged 26-44 years; 33.5% were aged 45-64; and 12.0% were aged 65 years and over. The median age was 42 years, compared to 37 years for total Victoria. The gender ratio was 94 males to 100 females, compared to 96 males to 100 females for total Victoria.

There were 5,287 persons identified with Syrian ancestry. Most of them were born in Australia (44.3%), Syria (38.2%) and Lebanon (6.8%). One-third (33.7%) of the Syria-born in Victoria had arrived in Australia prior to 1996; 6.1% arrived in 1996-2000; 6.3% arrived in 2001-2005; 8.1% arrived in 2006-2010; and 41.2% arrived in 2011-2016.

Most of the Syria-born speak Arabic (68.6%), Assyrian (19.8%) and Armenian (2.5%); 4.6% speak English only. Of those who speak a language other than English, 31.8% speak English not well/not at all. Almost one-third (29.9%) of the Syria-born are Muslim; 18.9% are Catholic; 12.0% are Assyrian Apostolic; 11.5% are Eastern Orthodox; and 7.6% are Oriental Orthodox; 5.4% have no religion. Over half (55.6%) of the Syria-born have Australian citizenship, compared to 58.3% for overseas-born in Victoria.



Economic characteristics

The education levels of the Syria-born are lower than those for total Victoria. Less of them (3.2%) have a postgraduate degree; 12.3% have a bachelor degree; and 7.2% have an advanced diploma or diploma, compared to 5.4%, 16.5% and 9.2% for Victoria. More of them (55.9%) have school education only or no educational attainment (6.5%), compared to 38.7% and 1.0% for Victoria.

The labour force participation rate of the Syria-born at 37.3% is lower than that of total Victoria at 60.5%. The unemployment rate for the Syria-born at 17.4% is higher than total Victoria at 6.6%.

The occupational patterns of the Syria-born are different from those for total Victoria. Less of the Syria-born are managers (10.4%), professionals (17.7%) and clerical & administrative workers (7.6%), compared to 13.5%, 23.3% and 13.3% for Victoria. More of them are community & personal service workers (13.0%), machinery operators & drivers (8.6%) and labourers (14.2%), compared to 10.6%, 5.8% and 9.0% for Victoria.

The employment patterns of the Syria-born are different from those for total Victoria. Less of them are employed in finance & insurance (1.2%) and professional, scientific, technical & administrative (9.3%), compared to 3.9% and 11.4% for Victoria. More of them are employed in manufacturing (9.5%) and accommodation & food services (11.1%), compared to 7.8% and 6.6% for Victoria.

The weekly personal income distribution pattern for the Syria-born is lower than for total Victoria. More of the Syria-born receive nil income (11.8%) and \$1-\$399 (44.1%), compared to 9.7% and 20.1% for Victoria. Less of them receive \$400-\$799 (21.6%), \$800-\$1,249 (9.4%), \$1,250-\$1,999 (5.5%) and \$2,000 or more (2.8%), compared to 23.1%, 16.7%, 13.6% and 7.5% for Victoria.
