
Job Interviews can be intimidating.

Use good body language.

When giving the speech, be sure to make good eye contact, sit up straight, and don't cross your arms.

Example of a good elevator pitch.



"Four years ago, I was charged with theft and I served 12 months for it.
It's something I really regret doing and I've been working to take control of my life since then.

I enrolled in a training program for warehousing and got my certificate III. I was employed as the warehouse supervisor while in prison and was responsible for training and mentoring new offenders.

Since I was released, I have been attending a support group for ex-offenders. I've spent a lot of time trying to turn things around and I'd like to continue moving forward in this direction with your company."
